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Lernergebnisse

The goal of the course „Landscape Governance and Politics“ is to enable students

- to understand the political character of landscapes,
- to distinguish different types of political power, which are relevant for planning and decision-making processes related to landscapes,
- to assess normative claims for landscape justice and landscape democracy,
- reflect upon the own role as planning professional, and
- to devise own research projects in this thematic field.

This course offers predominantly:

Professional expertise 60% Methodological expertise 15% Systems thinking 20% Social competence 5%.

Lehrinhalte

The course „Landscape Governance and Politics“ deals with landscapes from a political vantage point and draws on a political, reflexive notion of landscape. It makes use of examples such as wind energy, green infrastructure and the ecosystem services concept.

The interplay of different forms of governance takes centre stage: (a) Voluntary forms of cooperation in the frame of networks, which are based on negotiations. For instance, actors from the public and private sectors cooperate in preparing energy concepts at regional level, but also when it comes to informal participation approaches in spatial planning or tourism development in national park regions. (b) Formal institutions and hierarchical form of decision-making. This refers primarily to legislation concerning issues such as nature conservation, spatial planning and environmental impact assessment. Furthermore case law is of growing importance, for instance in view of designating priority areas for wind energy in spatial plans at regional level. (c) Larger systems of meaning and the resulting problematisations, political strategies and role models. These aspects are often taken for granted and remain unquestioned. However, it is an expression of power that certain problematisations prevail over others (e.g., the notion that conservation depends on economic incentives), that certain rationalities are adopted (e.g., preventing floods by technical measures) and that certain role models and identities are advocated and “lived” (e.g., the role of the active citizen who engages constructively for the public good).

Moreover, the course introduces different concepts of political power and demonstrates their relevance for landscapes. Another focus is on ideas of landscape justice and landscape democracy. Finally, options and methodological requirements for own research in this field will be addressed.
